

















INTRODUCTION

Manhattan, 2023: High up in her exclusive Upper East Side apartment, Christine Campbell, former journalist, turns on the television to watch a documentary paying homage to her Pulitzer Prize-shortlisted coverage of the unrest in 1999 in the North Caucasus. She is newly widowed, wealthy, and attempting to write a memoir celebrating her bold life and significant achievements in writing about the silencing of women during conflict.

But truth has a way of resurfacing, even when buried deep beneath money, memory, and reinvention. When Dr Frankie Pearson, Christine's oldest—and estranged—friend, knocks on her door, the pair must reconcile their memories and come to terms with the far-reaching and disastrous decisions they both made over twenty years ago. What really happened over twenty years ago in that small mountain village in Dagestan in the dying days of the millennium, while Christine was hellbent on getting the scoop of a lifetime?

An elegant, thrilling and brilliantly compelling novel of the consequences of the conflict between a person's principles and their desire for acclaim, *The Revisionists* examines the malleability of memory and the slippery nature of the truth—and the lengths that people will go to avoid facing both.



Matilda's life, in contrast, is solitary, contained, ordered. She works in one of Sydney's buzziest restaurants, Bocca, with an unrequited crush on her boss, celebrity chef Colson. If she's careful—and she always is—she can keep everything in its proper place. Hold the balance between hunger and satiation.


But when Lara's father, the long-absent, erratic Angus Del Ray, comes back into the sisters' lives, determined to apologise for his past misdeeds, Matilda's compartmentalised life goes seriously awry. As everything blows apart, Matilda is forced to come to a reckoning with who she is, and how to satisfy the hunger she wants to deny.

A sparkling delight of a novel, set in the Barossa Valley, where four very different women are thrown together in a creative writing course in the library of a small country town.

When international lawyer Matilda 'Tilly' Marr is dragged back from London to negotiate the purchase of a massive landholding in the South Australian wine country, she thinks she'll fly in and out in a matter of days with a billion-dollar contract under her arm. But hardnosed local matriarch Bev Jackson has a counteroffer of her own: the town's only solicitor has fled in disgrace, so if Tilly will work there pro bono for a month, Bev just might consider selling.

Tilly reluctantly agrees, setting up shop in the Beechwood Cafe. She's soon drawn into village life, joining a writing group and the rural fire brigade with Bev and two other local women: Fenna de Vries, a fallen TV star on the run from gossip columnists and a violent past; and Jane Robertson, the local librarian, an aunt to eighteen nieces and nephews, whose silent struggle to have a child might be blinding her to a different calling. And as Tilly discovers, Bev has a tragic secret of her own that she's kept for sixty years.

But life in the village isn't all writing and Riesling. Bushfire season is approaching, and a day of reckoning is coming for them all. Telling the truth and safely fighting fires often come down to the same question: Is what I am about to do really worth the risk, considering what's at stake?

Sometimes taking the chance to find your voice is what it takes to save your life.


How hard can it be to find a pair of Bollywood-dancing septuagenarians?

'If you think it's hard being a white woman in Australia, try being a black woman.' These were the words that set a team of journalists at the Adelaide Advertiser on an investigation into the tragic deaths of six young Indigenous women.

It was Courtney Hunter-Hebberman who uttered those words, up on stage at an International Women's Day event. A shocking number of Indigenous women die every year by murder or suicide, and Courtney's daughter, Rose, was one of them.

Rose's apparent death by suicide at 19, in a run-down backyard shed, had left her mother craving answers—answers the police seemed unable to give her.


Inspired by Courtney's courage and grief, *The Advertiser* team hoped to shed light on Rose's death and put Courtney's mind at rest. But what they found, as their investigation of one death rolled into another five, was disturbing. Lack of urgency, sloppy searches, poor communication, and assumptions by police were just some of the problems encountered in these cases.

As the team probed further, the answers, or lack thereof, gave rise to even bigger questions about whether Indigenous Australians, especially women are heard when they speak.

In 2003, Kathleen Folbigg was found guilty of smothering her four young children to death, one by one. Medical experts told her trial that they had never come across a family like hers, where three or more infants had died from natural causes. 

Born into a daring, musical family in 1886, Annette Kellerman was a force of nature and made for the stage - her first love - and encouraged to defy social norms from a young age. But after she was diagnosed with rickets as a child she took up swimming for therapy, and soon she became an Australian champion, beating boys, breaking records, and astonishing huge crowds by diving from great heights. By 1905, Annette was 18 and on her way to England in an attempt to swim the Channel and challenge endurance records in the Thames. Kellerman famously scandalised the public with a one-piece swimming costume that exposed her legs and arms, but her promotion of it changed fashion forever and popularised the sport for women as they were freed from cumbersome neck-to-knee outfits.

Annette thrilled audiences in London with a vaudeville act, and her underwater ballet routines, combined with her beauty and athleticism, helped her become known on both sides of the Atlantic as 'The Perfect Woman'. Hollywood embraced her and she became the first great sex symbol of silent films, with her risque and provocative costumes - and sometimes no costume at all. Annette was also one of the highest paid entertainers of her time and her story was immortalised in a lavish, Oscarnominated Hollywood production starring Esther Williams.
